Trinity School is looking for candidates with a flair and commitment for specific disciplines and dedication throughout their school life.





TRINITY SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

SPORT

Candidates must demonstrate outstanding sporting ability, potential, determination and enthusiasm. Successful candidates are likely to be of county standard or above. They will also respond well to guidance, work well in a team and demonstrate good leadership skills, whether by example or captaincy. Sports scholars should have exceptional talent in one or more sports, normally at least two. Preference will normally be given to those involved in the School's major games – rugby, athletics/cross-country, basketball, tennis and swimming for boys; netball, athletics/cross-country, basketball, tennis and swimming for girls. However, in the past we have awarded scholarships to students who have achieved national recognition in such sports as sailing, fencing and judo. Scholars will be expected to be good ambassadors and to demonstrate a willingness to contribute fully to the sporting and general life of the school. This includes a requirement for scholars to participate in at least two major sports on a regular basis and an expectation to train and play with teams during periods of study leave.

Prospective Sports Scholars will be required to:

- meet with the Director of Sport and the Head of Physical Education to discuss sporting CV.
- perform the sports offered.
- perform appropriate fitness tests.

All Sports Scholars are expected to contribute fully to the sporting life of the school in all three terms of the academic year.

ART

Candidates should have a record of commitment to art in a variety of media (which could include drawing, painting, photography, ceramics or some other medium). Candidates will present a portfolio of their work, undertake an appropriate task, and will be interviewed by the Head of Art.

All Art Scholars will be expected to be good ambassadors and to demonstrate a willingness to contribute fully to the artistic and general life of the school.

MUSIC

Candidates should have a record of commitment to music making in their school or another setting (e.g. local or county orchestra or choir). Candidates will present a prepared piece on their instrument(s), some scales at the appropriate level, to be prepared to be given some sight reading at the appropriate level and to know something about their instrument(s) and the pieces they are offering. They should also be prepared for a short interview.

For 16+ entry candidates are expected to have achieved a pass at grade 6 or better in their main instrument. They should also show evidence of theoretical knowledge at grade 5 level, evidence of compositional skills and, hopefully, a good GCSE grade (at least B). For overseas students a good grasp of the linguistic and technical language of music (e.g. performance directions in Italian, French and German) is required.

All Music Scholars are expected to take part in as many groups, ensembles and choirs as possible and to perform in concerts both in and outside school.

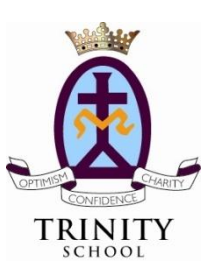
THEATRE

Candidates will have a record of commitment to drama in their school or in another setting (e.g. dramatic society). Candidates will be considered whose experience is either acting or technical support (e.g. set building, lighting, sound, video production etc). Those who offer acting as their expertise should have taken a major role in at least one production. Those who are offering technical support should have had major responsibilities in at least one production.

Candidates should bring a portfolio of their achievements on the day to show the Head of Drama. Candidates offering acting will be expected to perform a piece of their own choice and to deliver a piece given to them on the day. Candidates offering technical support will be asked to demonstrate the principles of lighting and sound, or offer a portfolio detailing their set design or construction work. All candidates will be interviewed by the Head of Drama.

All Theatre Scholars would be expected to make a significant contribution to school productions.

PLEASE NOTE: All scholarships are reviewed annually and their continuance is dependent upon satisfactory conduct, attitude, participation and progress. At such a review, holders of awards are expected to assess their own contribution and to set targets for themselves.

VALUE OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Up to five scholarships will be awarded each year.

Scholarships are awarded as a percentage of the fees.

The maximum scholarship may be worth 50% of school fees.

Awards may be augmented in cases of financial need by the granting of a bursary subject to completion of a statement of parental income. Bursary awards will be subject to annual review.

ARRANGEMENT FOR THE EXAMINATION

Candidates may be required to stay overnight. Accommodation will be provided.

The School will send all details about the examination arrangements to the candidate's school and parents.

Head Teachers of schools who are entering candidates for the examination are asked to send in a report on their candidates before the examination. This includes a general assessment of character and comments on academic potential and on the candidate's particular contributions.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRY

Candidates should have reached their tenth birthday for 11+ entry, their twelfth birthday for 13+ entry or fifteenth birthday for 16+ entry on 1st September preceding the examination.

Candidates who apply for a scholarship may also apply for a Notre Dame Award, but will only be entitled to hold more than one of these awards in exceptional circumstances.

Candidates who receive a Scholarship will also be required to sit the relevant assessment test.

The scholarships are open to boarders and day students.

Applications for a scholarship are made in co-operation with the candidate's school. The Head Teacher must be consulted before the application is submitted.

The scholarship application form must have been completed.

CONDITIONS

The Headmaster reserves the right not to award all the scholarships offered if candidates do not reach a sufficiently high standard.

Parents are asked to notify the acceptance of the scholarship in writing.

Normally scholarships are tenable for the whole of a student's school career, but all scholarships are reviewed annually and their continuance is dependent upon satisfactory conduct, attitude, participation and progress. At such a review, holders of awards are expected to assess their own contribution and to set targets for themselves.
