Reception have been learning about growing this week. They have planted some beans and some sunflower seeds and they are keeping an eye on them to make sure they grow. Watch this space!

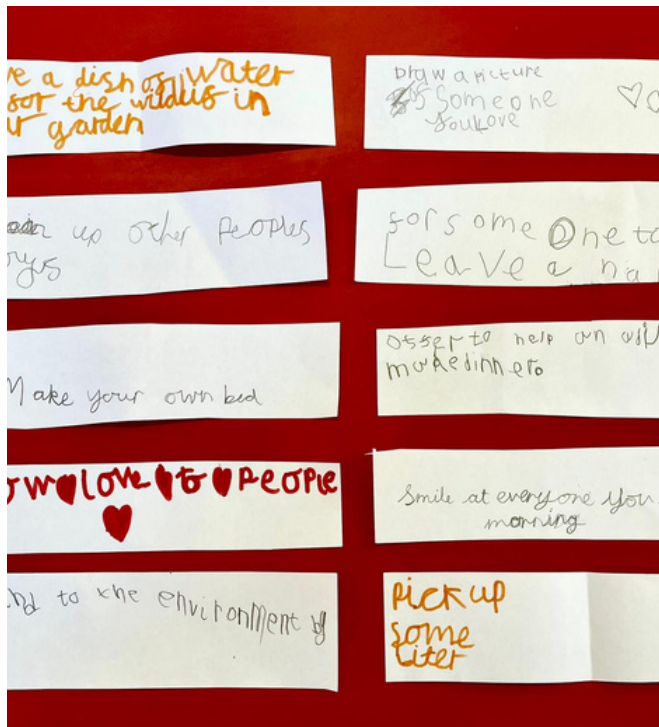
Around the classes
