

Senior School Uniform – Dress and Appearance Policy



Uniform

- Only items listed on the School Uniform List may be worn in School and for PE/Games. All items must be clearly marked with the pupil's name.
- Uniform must be clean and worn in a presentable way at all times. Pupils must ensure that they are correctly dressed on leaving for school and on arriving home.
- Blazers are compulsory uniform. Only dark coloured coats/jackets may be worn over blazers, not instead of blazers.
- Hoodies/non-uniform sweaters/tank-tops/ tracksuit-tops/sports jackets/school sweatshirts are not permitted under blazers. This includes break and lunch times. School sweaters are available from the School Shop and should be worn in addition to the blazer in cold weather.
- No cardigans – only school sweaters under blazers.
- Blazers must be worn at all times outside of the classroom.
- Any t-shirts/camisoles/vests worn under shirts must be plain white and have no writing/logos. They must not be visible at the neck or at the waistline.
- Sports uniform or Elite Football Programme kit must not be worn to lessons without permission.
- Scarves must be either dark blue or black and plain. School scarves in House colours are also available from the School Shop.
- Sanctions will be given for non-compliance.

Boys

- Boys' trousers should be the regulation shade of grey (not charcoal or black), belts should be black and socks dark grey or black. White socks are not permitted.
- Top shirt buttons should be done up and ties worn correctly, shirts should be tucked in at all times.
- Pupils must wear leather or faux leather shoes. Branded trainers or plimsoll type shoes are not permitted.

Girls

- Girls' black shoes must have low heels, not more than 1½ inches. 'Dollies' or pumps are not permitted. Shoes must not be flimsy and must have a proper fastening or laces. Pupils must wear leather or faux leather shoes. Branded trainers or plimsoll type shoes are not permitted.
- Pupils can either wear white ankle socks (not trainer socks) or black tights or knee length black socks.
- Skirts must be of a suitable length i.e. no shorter than just above the knee.

Boys Jewellery and Hair

- A small religious symbol on a chain may be worn around the neck under a pupil's shirt so it cannot be seen. Earrings for pierced ears should be plain studs, which should be worn at the bottom of the ear. Two per ear may be worn. Other jewellery is not allowed and facial piercings are not permitted.
- All jewellery must be removed for games lessons.
- Any died or tinted hair must be the pupil's natural colour. Hair must not cover the eyes and must be neat. Hair should be no shorter than grade 2 on the sides and back, and there must not be an excessive difference between length of hair on top and on the sides. The excessive use of gel and/or shapes shaved into hair is not acceptable.
- Facial hair is not permitted.

Girls Jewellery and Hair

- A small religious symbol on a chain may be worn around the neck under a pupil's shirt so it cannot be seen. Earrings for pierced ears should be plain studs, which should be worn at the bottom of the ear. Two per ear may be worn. Other jewellery is not allowed including bracelets and rings and facial piercings are not permitted.
- All jewellery must be removed for games lessons.
- Any died or tinted hair must be the pupil's natural colour. Hair must not cover the eyes and must be neat. Hair should be no shorter than grade 2 on the sides and back, and there must not be an excessive difference between length of hair on top and on the sides. The excessive use of gel and/or shapes shaved into hair is not acceptable.
- Natural minimal make-up may be worn but excessive eye make-up, false lashes and lip colour are not permitted. Nails must be kept short and free from varnish. False/acrylic/gel nails are not permitted.

Note: In 2026-27, all pupils will wear the new school uniform with the new Trinity School logo.
